APA REFERENCING – HOW TO'S

Tips:

- Your <u>Reference List</u> is arranged alphabetically by author's last name.
- Begin your Reference List when you start your assessment task.
- If a text has more than one author, write the names in the same order as they are on the cover/ title page of the book.
- Insert <u>in-text citations</u> as you write.
- For three or more authors in an <u>in-text citation</u>, use **et al.** (Latin for 'and others') after the first author.
- Refer to WSU APA guide (link available on GPHS website) for further guidance.
